CORFE CASTLE PARISH COUNCIL

OCTOBER AT THE PARISH COUNCIL

The Parish Council was pleased to be addressed by several residents in the public half hour. Mr Michael Bond suggested the Council should be supporting the District Council allocation of housing development in the village as well as pursuing exception sites to provide for local people. He suggested the new planning policies would ensure affordable housing, the properties being sold at market value subsidising the affordable properties which would comprise the other 50% of any prospective development. Mr Tony Speed did not support an allocation of 30 houses if it was likely that the properties would be occupied by anyone who was not local. This is a matter that would be discussed at the District Council on the following evening as the second part of the Special Core Strategy Meeting (first part at the Purbeck School, a week before). The Parish Council is not supporting the allocation of 30 houses to the village as it is only in favour of 'exception sites' for affordable housing.

Mr Roy Christopher and Tessa Somerville (both residents of Jubilee Gardens) explained their opposition to the planning application in respect of Wimborne Mead, Jubilee Gardens which was before the Council for comment.

Another resident approached the Council for advice about correcting poor living conditions in a rented property.

The Council has now received a plan from Dorset County Council (DCC) showing the proposed zebra crossing outside the school. The Members discussed and ratified the proposals and will be urging the DCC officers to take the scheme forward to the next stage of Public Consultation. The existing crossing by the Square has been modified to make the lights easier to see for traffic coming up the hill as a result of Councillor Rob Green meeting DCC officers on site.

Complaints were received during the summer, from both visitors and local people, about the appearance of the bottom of the Castle mound and the approach to the village (from the north). Upon investigation this was found to be a loss of pavement around the Castle mound caused by soil build up (and weeds growing in it). This is causing visitors using this route to be walking nearer the oncoming traffic with the attendant risks. County Council Highway officers initially suggested action to rectify it by the end of the summer but this now looks like being in November when the Parish Maintenance Unit returns. Please let Councillor Green know of any other highway problems as soon as possible. He will pass them on to the County Council for November action.

CORFE CASTLE PARISH COUNCIL

The Parish Council made financial contributions to the Dorset and Somerset Air Ambulance, the Corfe Valley News, the Dubber and the Dorset Citizens Advice Bureau. The Council passed the annual external audit with only minor matters arising.

The Council considers all planning applications in the Parish and submits comments to the District Council. Councillors had no objection to the following applications : The reinstatement of staff quarters following extensive fire damage at Mortons House Hotel, East Street, Corfe Castle. The erection of a garden room at 47 East Street, Corfe Castle, Wareham. The erection of a freestanding historical timeline display board at The Square, Corfe Castle.

The Parish Council did object to the following applications: the demolition of an existing dwelling and the erection of two detached single storey dwellings with new vehicular and pedestrian access at Wimborne Mead, Jubilee Gardens, Corfe Castle. *The Council suggests this proposal is over development of the site. The access is poor for any increase in density and the proposal will block light to neighbouring properties.* The erection of a single storey extension to an existing garage to form a studio; construct a stone chimney (Amended scheme to PP 6/2010/0107) at 28 West Street, Corfe Castle. *The Council suggests this proposal is an inappropriate development within the Conservation Area. The proposal will adversely affect close neighbouring properties in this part of West Street.*

Retiring collection in aid of the Fabric Fund

We were blessed in October with many glorious sunny days; a welcome treat for gardeners whom are still busy at their allotments. We are harvesting and preparing to store the last of our summer fruit and veg, tidying our plots and preparing our soil for the winter months. If, like me, you're aiming to grow veg all year round, there are still vegetables that can be sown in November, and with a bit of forward planning it's possible to be harvesting tasty veg throughout the winter months.



What to sow in November

Broad Beans (harvest March)

Peas (harvest April)

Garlic (harvest July)

Those below will grow indoors and/or on a windowsill. Salad Leaves e.g. Lettuce, Watercress, Rocket (harvest - February) Sprouting Seeds e.g. Mung Beans - sow all year (harvest all year) Mushrooms - sow all year (harvest all year) using mushroom kits

Winter growing vegetables

Celeriac: sow in February (harvest September - March) Jerusalem Artichoke: plant February (harvest October - March) Brussels Sprouts: sow in February (harvest October - April) Parsnip: sow in March (harvest August - March) Leek: sow in March (harvest September - May) Cabbages: sow in April (harvest November - March) Cauliflours: sow in April (harvest November - May) Swede: sow in April (harvest September - February) Chicory: sow May (harvest October - Jan) Kale: sow in April (harvest December - April) Perpetual Spinach: sow mid-July (harvest - March) Winter Purslane: sow in August (harvest November - March) Some of the above should be planted in a polytunnel, cold frame or unheated greenhouse or possibly under fleece outside. **Growing Pains...** There won't be a single Brussels Sprout from my allotment on my plate this Christmas, and it seems that I won't be the only one in the village. Why? Because they've 'blown', which is when the sprouts open into rosettes rather than forming tight buttons. If you want your sprouts to sprout, don't grow them in loose soil, keep them regularly watered and make sure they are not shaken by wind by staking them.

Up the Allotments...

This year, the allotments have seen a lot of change. The biggest being that sadly, after more than 30 years, Ken and Joy Williams have decided to give up their plot. As a newcomer to the allotments, I was looking forward to chatting to them and learning from their immense knowledge that they are happy to share. However, on a positive note, we have at least 7 families from the village who want a plot, and if negotiations with the National Trust over price for the spare land go well, we could be looking at housing 10 new plots which is brilliant news. GREEN MANURE

If you have empty space after the harvest, consider growing green manure to suppress weeds, protect soil from erosion and add structure. Feild Beans, Mustard and Phacelia can all be sown now. Sow as normal and cut before they seed.



Roast Vegetable Medley Ingredients

4 parsnip, quartered lengthways 2 red onions, cut into thin wedges 4 carrots, thickly sliced 2 leek, thickly sliced 1 small swede, cut into bite sized pieces 4 potatoes, cut into chunks 4 tbsp olive oil few sprigs of fresh thyme 1 garlic bulb, unpeeled 1 litre vegetable stock salt and pepper fresh thyme sprigs to garnish 1. Preheat oven to 200^oC/400^oF/Gas 6. Place parsnip, onions, carrots, leek, swede and potatoes in a roasting tin in an even laver. 2. Drizzle oil over veg and add the thyme sprigs and unpeeled garlic cloves. Toss well to coat with oil and roast for 45 mins.

3. Discard the thyme and squeeze the garlic cloves from their skin over veg.

4. Process half the veg with the stock in a food processor or blender until almost smooth. Pour into pan and add the remaining veg. Bring to the boil and season well with salt and pepper.

5. Ladle the soup into bowls and garnish with fresh thyme leaves and enjoy!

News from the National Trust in Purbeck – November 2010

In response to our recent deer management meeting held in Studland village we wish to clarify our current approach to deer management as well as adapt it to reflect feedback we have received. Whilst we recognise that the meeting did not reassure local people or communicate our message we hope this document goes some way to do so. An internal review of the meeting has been held to ensure this does not happen again.

We will continue to work in a cohesive manner with our neighbours across Purbeck to ensure that our deer management is successful by operating across land boundaries. In recognition of the feedback we received in September from you we will increase our cull rate and concentrate our efforts in areas we have not culled in the past which can lead to hotspots of deer damage. This change will take effect immediately during the current cull season.

We will therefore increase the number of stalkers involved across our land and target their efforts in and around the following areas; Kingswood, Scotland Farm, and Studland village, as well as continuing to stalk over the other areas of our property. To focus efforts in Studland village we have decided to use a National Trust member of staff (gualified stalker) to cull deer in this area.

We hope that this action will go some way to reassuring our local communities that we are tackling this issue and that we recognise how important it is to you. As you have requested we will meet regularly to discuss our progress with you. The next meeting will be in April once the cull season is complete. This will be an opportunity to comment on the success or otherwise of this approach. This will then feed into our planning for the 2011/12 cull season.

Corfe Castle Weather Report for September 2010

September Winds: In my Coast Watch days at the Peveril Point look-out, Swanage we called it a Hurricane or "wind force 12" (Beaufort) or wind force 70 or stronger" (miles per hour) or "wind force 63 or stronger" (knots). This was the storm above Corfe Castle, and probably most of the UK, which raged during the last night of the month. The constant whine of the wind and thrum of the rain together with strong gusts, with the frequency of the puffs of a slow moving steam engine on the Corfe to Swanage rail line, was awesome as the barometer dropped sharply during the night to 29.48" and the storm came upon us from the southeast, Corfe Castle was probably near the eye of the storm, but happily no harm was done to anybody or anything. Little variation in barometer movements and gentle winds from most directions brought a little more rain, evenly spread throughout the month.

<u>September Rainfall</u> - 66.3mm (2.5/8"), which is 18.9pc below the 19 years average for September of 81.8mm (3.1/4"). Much of this rainfall fell during the time of the Hurricane (37.3mm = 1.1/2"), the rest was spread evenly through the month, with many sunny days and misty mornings between showers. A sentence often heard was: "These lovely Autumn days are truly worth waiting for".

January to September Rainfall - 561.2mm (22.1/8"), which is 11.9pc below the 19 years average for this period of 636.8mm (25.1/8"). Our summer really was dry, so there is some catching up to expect!

It may be of interest to farmers and gardeners that the frost-free period this year was from 11th May to 26th September, that is 138 days. This period is 39 days or 22pc shorter than the average for the last 9 years of 177 days. Some may suggest that this little bit of statistic helps to show that Corfe Castle is still cool...

THOSE DARING YOUNG MEN IN THEIR FLYING MACHINES: Congratulations Jock, on your 90^{th} birthday, recently celebrated on 26 October. Jock (John) Carrington-Mail, retired RN Commander and WWII Test Pilot, was born in New Zealand, the son of a doctor and spent much of his childhood in Apia. on the Polynesian Island of Western Samoa. They were living quite close to Robert Stephenson's Louis home. which is now a museum. As a young man at university, back home in Christchurch, he and a fellow medical student, went to the cinema one evening. During performance, the an announcement was flashed up on the screen, encouraging young men to join the Fleet Air Arm. Why not! As a result of that evening's visit to the cinema, we have the pleasure of knowing Jock and Elisabeth as residents of Corfe Castle. Let me tell you a story. Jock joined the Fleet Air Arm and, in 1940, was sent to England for training with

the RN. In 1944, he was drafted to India, under the command of Mountbatten and posted to Southern India. Later he was based in Ceylon (Sri Lanka) test flying planes for the fleet, mostly single but some twin engines. In 1946, he transferred to the Royal Navy. Jock and Elisabeth met in London and married in 1947. He continued his career with the Royal Navy, serving on ships and based in Plymouth. In 1953, he left the Navy but continued his connection with the RNR. Subsequently he worked at NATO headquarters in Northwood Naval Establishment, working in underground secret passages. In 1960, with a complete career change, he worked with a Fund-raising Charitable Organisation. In 1977, they moved from Maids Moreton village in Buckinghamshire, to Corfe Castle. Since their arrival here, they have lived in several houses in the Village, including Meadowside, now happily settled in Mead Road. Both

Jock and Elisabeth (born in India, her father with the Police) have been on the move, with their family backgrounds, from a very early age. They say, with great pride, that Corfe Castle is the place where they've lived longest and, in fact, for more than half their married life. Jock and Elisabeth have 2 daughters, Wendy and Sandra, and 7 One grandchildren. granddaughter is training to swim the Channel, fundraising, in 2011. It is interesting to know that the stone for the walls of the War Memorial Arch in East Street were given by the Bankes Estate and came from the demolished West Mill cottages. This you can read all about in 'Corfe Castle 2000 – A Diary of the Village', written on Tuesday, November. The Arch was designed by Francis G. Newberry, former Professor of Art at Glasgow University. Some of its features were due to suggestions put forward by Dr. Godfrey Dru Drury. The dedication took place on 11 November 1922. In this month of Remembrance, such local knowledge is appropriate and interesting. 

News from the Purbeck Marine Wildlife Reserve

Winter is coming and as well as cold weather it can bring strong winds and storms. Though the idea of visiting the beach in cold weather may not be everyone's cup of tea, this is a great time of year for a spot of beach-combing with the chance to discover something exciting that has been washed up. Several types of goose barnacles and 'exotic' crabs have been washed up in recent years so it will be interesting to see what this year brings us!

Unfortunately the storms also have a negative impact on the strandline habitat by washing up lots of unwanted litter and plastics. The marine team at Kimmeridge organises regular beach clean events throughout the year to try to minimise this impact on our wildlife. The most recent beach clean took place at Worbarrow Bay on the 19th September. Despite the early start over 70 volunteers turned up to do their bit for the marine environment and between them collected 188 Kg of rubbish!

To reach the parts other beach cleans cannot reach, on Sunday 26th September 23 members of the Poole Harbour Canoe club along with their Junior branch, paddled along the coast from Kimmeridge to Chapmans Pool and cleared up over 60 sacks full of litter along the way. A big 'well-done and thankyou' to them for their efforts.





The Reverend Andrea Hagenbuch writes





"Remember, remember the fifth of November, gunpowder, treason and plot."

It was back in 1605 that Mr Fawkes, Mr Catesby and co. managed to arrange 35 barrels of gunpowder to be in the vaults under the Houses of Parliament. They were betrayed by an anonymous letter that gave warning to certain persons and advised they stay away from Parliament on the 5th November. This letter was subsequently passed to the king and a search of the undercrofts, or cellars, revealed Guy Fawkes keeping guard over his barrels. Initially Guy Fawkes wouldn't reveal his co-conspirators but under torture all the names the authorities wanted were soon revealed. They were betrayed (some would say that it was a government sting), arrested and executed. And that was that well no. Down the years we have remembered this event. Trust the British to celebrate an attempt to bring down the government.

Christians also remember treason, plot, betrayal, arrest and execution. Not 'gunpowder' or 'hanging' but crucifixion. The death of Jesus, however, was not because he wanted to bring down the government but because he wanted to bring up sinners to God.

Both events were brutal, full of mystery and intrigue, yet their outcomes are so different. One was intended to kill vast numbers of people, especially the king, the other to bring eternal life.

One was a failure (the Stuart monarchy and Parliament carried on), the other a success (millions have come to forgiveness of sins and eternal life). To remember Guy Fawkes is to remember someone who is dead: to remember Jesus Christ is to remember someone who is alive. How can that be? Because Jesus rose from the dead three days after he was executed and is alive today.

Do you remember Jesus in the same way as you remember Guy Fawkes? Is he only just a passing interest, mainly for kids, a bit of tradition, unrelated to everyday life? If you think of Jesus along those lines then that would be the biggest mistake of your life!


KINGSTON NEWS



Draft development blueprint for Purbeck finalised

At the concluding half of Purbeck District Council's Special Council Meeting Members finalised the draft Core Strategy, a blueprint which will shape future development in the district.

Around 40 residents attended the meeting and many spoke about the proposals for the district. They then listened to Councillors debate the issues and vote on items to be included in a further consultation next year and on the finer detail of the draft Core Strategy.

It was agreed that a final public consultation on the Core Strategy will take place from 1 November to 20 December 2010. It will include three housing sites:

- 70 dwellings at Policeman's Lane, Upton (28 affordable),
- 200 dwellings at Worgret Road, Wareham (80 affordable)
- 50 dwellings at Huntick Road, Lytchett Matravers (28 affordable)

Sites for additional homes will be found through further public consultation in Swanage (200 homes with 100 affordable), Bere Regis (50 homes with 20 affordable) and Bovington (30 military dwellings). Healthcare issues, a care home and a potential free school will be further explored in parallel at Swanage.

Proposed housing allocations in Corfe Castle and Wool have been deleted.

Councillor Martyn Colvey, Built Environment Spokesperson for Purbeck District Council, said: "The Core Strategy will now go for one final public consultation before it is sent to the Planning Inspector. After a couple of long Council meetings and much prior work, we have produced a set of plans that meet the needs of the whole district. It has a focus on affordable housing to enable our communities to thrive in balance with the natural environment."


